Increasing financial protection against catastrophic health expenditures

In Ethiopia, we supported the scale up of the national Community-Based Health Insurance program to cover 14.5 million people. Working with our technical experts, Ethiopia has doubled the rates of health service utilization in 318 districts, reduced out-of-pocket health expenditures for the national population by 4 percent, and increased enrollment in health insurance from 1 to 18 percent.





Reaching the most vulnerable with needed care

In Papua New Guinea, we worked through a local non-governmental organization, Susu Mamas, to help rehabilitate health facilities and establish more than 100 rural outreach clinics to deliver reproductive and sexual health, antenatal and postnatal care services and breastfeeding support to more than 23,000 women. Abt provided technical assistance, grants and research management, procurement and logistics services to local partners to increase access to care for disadvantaged rural populations.







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Ensuring quality while expanding access

In Uganda, we contributed to the sustainability of the private health care system. We strengthened the capacity of 33 districts to work with private providers to increase access to quality obstetric, newborn and postpartum family planning services for poor women through the use of vouchers. From 2016 to 2018, 149,137 subsidized vouchers were sold; one result was that more than 58,000 newborns were delivered in high-quality facilities with skilled attendants.









Testing new payment and delivery models of care

Lowering cost without sacrificing quality of care is a priority for health systems, irrespective of a country's level of wealth and development. In the U.S., we conducted a study involving 60,000 Medicare beneficiaries to test whether bundled payments, a new payment and delivery model that keeps costs under a predetermined target price, resulted in reduced care quality. The results indicate that both quality of care and patient-reported care experiences were not jeopardized under this new scheme.



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Integrating HIV/AIDS services into social health insurance

In Vietnam, we ensured financial sustainability of HIV/AIDS services by supporting the transition from donor funding to domestic resource mobilization through management, policy and financing strategies. As a results, Vietnam formally added HIV/AIDS services to its social health insurance, centralized procurement of antiretroviral drugs, and integrated HIV outpatient clinics into the public service delivery system, making them eligible for reimbursement by the social health insurance. This expanded coverage is projected to avert more than 2,500 HIV-related deaths by 2022.





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Facilitating a data-driven total market approach

In Kenya, Senegal and other countries, we work with private pharmacies and larger health facilities to increase private sector reporting into government health management information systems (HMIS) via DHIS2-based platforms. These efforts will generate more frequent, routine service statistics from the private sector to complement data coming from public and NGO facilities. Together, they will give government stakeholders a more accurate understanding of the total health system.
